Hearing

Meditating

Joshua 1:8

Joshua 1:8 New King James Version (NKJV)

This Book of the Law shall not depart from your mouth, but you shall meditate in it day and night, that you may observe to do according to all that is written in it. For then you will make your way prosperous, and then you will have good success.

What Biblical Meditation Isn't

1. Sitting with an empty mind - IT'S NOT "**MINDFULNESS**".
2. Mindlessly repeating a single word or phrase to gain some sort of altered state.
3. Burning candles, or sitting calmly on a rug, or listening to sonorous music.
4. Practicing yoga.
5. Biblical meditation isn't even primarily for relaxation, although you may find it calming and comforting. It's not about controlling your breathing, although there may be times when deep breaths are helpful. It's never mindless; instead meditation means that your mind is focused on God and His Word.

What Biblical Meditation Is

1. Not only is biblical meditation about focusing on God through contemplation on His Word, it's about quieting our hearts with Scripture and a deeper intimacy with Jesus.
2. Mulling it over - "chewing the cud".

3. The particulars of biblical meditation can vary, but the practice isn't complicated. Think about a passage you are reading in a daily reading schedule, etc. Take each section of Scripture and look at each part of it until you've truly absorbed its meaning. If you've ever sat with a Scripture and gone over it repeatedly, trying to understand each word, you've meditated.
4. Meditation implies wonder and thought, remembering the Lord in all His glory and thanking Him for all He's done.
